As a Parent / Carer, please speak to your child about our SAFEGUARDING UPDATE – COUNTY LINES

This term is used to describe urban gangs that supply drugs to suburban areas using dedicated mobile phone lines known as 'deal lines'. Children will probably use a slang term to describe being involved in the process: Country, OT, Bando, Trap, Cuntch, Lonqlines, Going Long.

There is the potential for any young person to be targeted and signs to look out for may include: a change in behaviour, signs of assault and/or malnutrition, access to numerous phones, use of unusual terms, eg 'going country', associating with gangs, unexplained travel tickets, school truancy or going missing, unexplained gifts, eg clothes, trainers and cash.

Trust your instincts, and if you have any concerns you can phone your local police by dialling 101, or in an emergency 999. If you wish to remain anonymous, you can also contact the independent charity Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111, or use the untraceable anonymous online form www.crimestoppers-uk.org
Contact Childline on 0800 1111 or you can speak to a children and young people's service like Catch 22.

A letter regarding the illness must be handed in on the first day that your daughter / son returns to school.

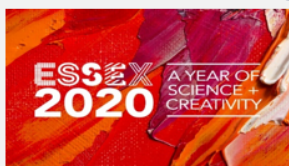
